Health authority receives ambulances from envoy

THE Enga health authority (EPHA) has received six fully kitted ambulances last week, thanks to the Japanese government.

Ambassador Satoshi Nakajima when presenting the keys to the authority, said the ambulances were donated by the people of Japan through the grassroots programme.

Nakajima said the ambulances were given to serve the people of Enga and he hoped this would imporve health services in the province.

He added that "The donation of the ambulances was made possible with the grant of Japan grassroots human security assistance scheme so that can help the health care of the people. "The ambulances were reconditioned and fully kitted in Japan with a stretcher, oxygen cylinder, masks and other medical instrument set for emergencies.

"These ambulances are important for the mobility of basic health and it is our hope that many lives would be saved with the quick transport of patients to the emergency care by these ambulances."

The authority's chief executive officer Aaron Luai thanked Nakajima for the support. Luai said "I believe that with the

assistance from the ambulance many lives in Enga can be saved.

"It will improve our services."
